# The LS is not a Social Feast

- I Corinthians 11:20-22, 34

## How often may the LS be served?

- I Corinthians 11:33
- The “waiting” in its context (cf. I Corinthians 11:21)
- The command is to partake in the assembly (first day of week).
- **Purpose** includes assembly yet is an individual act.

# Are we eating the Lord's Breakfast?

- “On Saturday evening we gathered together for the fellowship meal” (Acts 20:7) (Good News Bible).
- Example of Jewish time (Lev. 23:31-32)
- Example of Roman Method (Jn. 20:1,19)
- The record of Jesus' trial and crucifixion
- What time method was Luke using in Acts 20:7?

# Are we using too many cups?

- Matthew 26:27-28
- I Corinthians 11:25-26
- AG on the “cup” = “cup, drinking vessel... the cup stands, by metonymy, for what it contains (695).
- Examples of metonymy
